SPARC aims to improve the sexual and reproductive health and rights (SRHR) of some of the most vulnerable women and adolescent girls in six districts of Cabo Delgado province in Mozambique: Mueda, Muidumbe, Nangade, Namuno, Balama, and Montepuez.

<sup>6</sup> Individuals that are not the primary stakeholders of the project, but that will experience a change in capacity and behaviour, practices or performance which will enable them to contribute to the program's efforts to improve wellbeing of primary stakeholders. For example, this might include teachers or education officials in an education program, or traditional community leaders in a women's empowerment program.
